

An icon of the Perth arts scene and a Fremantle local, Susan Flavell's work takes many forms – from drawing to ceramics; textiles to metals – but it's her huge cardboard sculptures that really can't be ignored. Once one of her massive

beast-like forms occupies a space, it owns it, and you, the viewer, become the viewed. Not that her pieces are intimidating – quite the opposite – the familiarity of the simple cardboard construction lends them a casual air.







